

In Memory of...

Ann Gilchrist

Fraternal organizations are institutions that heavily romanticize our pasts to encourage our future. We remember the men that founded the Fraternity. We remember the men that founded our chapters. We remember our leaders that significantly shaped our organization. In our case, as a men's fraternity, we have a woman deserving of that same remembrance.

Ann Gilchrist was probably the most recognizable woman ever to be connected to AKL;



She was one of the longest serving employees of the National Headquarter working for AKL longer than even her husband, Keith Gilchrist. She was a surrogate mother and/or grandmother figure to many AKL staff members that cycled through the offices between 1987 to 2016. Prior to 1987 she was continually by her husband's side helping him as a volunteer.

Alpha Kappa Lambda recognized Ann's support of our organization in 2014 when a new award, the Ann Gilchrist Staff Award for Professional Excellence, was announced at our Centennial Conclave in her honor. Ann's involvement in the fraternal movement goes further than AKL though.



Clark - Thompson Presidents' Academy, Officers' Institute, and Emerging Leaders Initiative

The Fraternity of Alpha Kappa Lambda is excited that the 2023 Clark - Thompson Presidents' Academy, Officers' Institute, and Emerging Leaders Initiative is rapidly approaching!

For newly elected officers and members, you should be signed up to attend our annual leadership training.

The Fraternity of Alpha Kappa Lambda proudly provides annual training for incoming chapter presidents and officers annually every January. The Clark-Thompson Presidents' Academy is generously supported via a grant from the AKL Education Foundation.

In 2007, the Mu Chapter Alumni Corporation decided to graciously support the AKL Education Foundation and this program specifically through an endowment in honor of two of their alumni, Dean Clark and Harry Thompson.

The Officers' Institute was added in 2014 in an effort to train and develop effective leaders in the chapter with Chapter Presidents, Chapter Treasurers, Recruitment Chairs, Vice Presidents, and Risk Managers are all invited to attend with specific programming for each officer training.

Additionally, the Fraternity is thrilled to host our second annual Emerging Leaders Initiative alongside the 2023 Officers' Institute! The Emerging Leaders Initiative is geared towards the Fraternity's most motivated members who are looking to take on leadership within their chapter, on-campus, or in the larger community.

This leadership development training program focuses on each participant's individual strengths as a leader and how to leverage those to be a leader and teammate while developing professional development skills.

National Conclave Changes

Adapting To A New Reality

As the world changes and evolves so must Alpha Kappa Lambda.

Since our beginning, the Conclave was a signature summer event that brought AKL's from around the country to one location to celebrate our successes and determine the future of our organization. The locations for these events have been in every part of the country and in one case international. They occurred in places like airport hotels, resorts, and college campuses.

The attendees have been both undergraduates from our active chapters and alumni from both active and closed chapters. Great friendships and memories have been made at these events over the years. Things do change though.

It used to be that undergraduates had the summer off. Now they have internships, jobs or summer classes making it difficult to travel. Higher education costs continue to climb making it harder for our members to afford these extra activities. Our alumni engagement has declined as travel has become more expensive and family vacation time more limited.

The pandemic also changed people's interest in meeting face to face. The reality is our Conclave has become a very expensive event that is not well attended.

The National Executive Council has made the decision that it is time to change Conclave.



Starting in 2024 Conclave will be held in conjunction with our annual Officers' Academy which occurs in January.

There are numerous benefits to this change. Our Officers' Academy is currently significantly supported by the AKL Education Foundation and well attended by multiple members of most chapters.

If this support continues it means greatly reduced or eliminated costs for our undergraduates to participate in Conclave activities. The time of year is not "ideal" for weather, but it is a time that we believe is easier for students to attend.

This change also allows the Fraternity to use the cost savings it experiences to coordinate potential regional alumni events around the country at different times of the year.

In 2024 the National Conclave will be held in Williamsburg, Virginia on the weekend of January 5th. Contractual obligations related to the pandemic are the reason for this.

No decision has been made for 2026 but more than likely it will be held in Indianapolis for the purposes of cost savings. Alumni are still encouraged to attend. Our awards program will be adjusted to reflect the new time of year. Business of the Fraternity will still be handled. Stay tuned for more information.

Remember Our Responsibilities

Fulfilling the Obligations of Life

Be Safe. Be Smart. Be Men of Character.

The health and safety of our brothers is an important area of membership in Alpha Kappa Lambda. As we transition into the academic semester ahead, it is an important time to “remember our responsibilities” and remind our brothers to take the same care in order to meet the obligations of life and fraternity operations. There are many responsibilities when joining a fraternity that we must uphold as we continue our membership in AKL. Including living by the Creed of AKL, Risk Management Best Practices, and what it means to be a “Man of Character Committed to Making a Difference.”

Risk Management Guidelines

The Alpha Kappa Lambda Risk Management Guidelines include the following provisions and recommendations. These are intended to apply to all levels of membership in the organization. For the full guidelines, visit www.AKL.org.

Finances & Paying National Dues

As a part of membership in any organization, a financial commitment is integral to the operation of Alpha Kappa Lambda chapters. It is members’ responsibility to pay their dues and it is the chapter’s responsibility to hold their members accountable. Chapter Roster Updates Membership & Billing Statuses

Prior to the start of each semester, chapter leadership must update their chapter’s roster with AKL National Headquarters on OmegaFi Vault. There are only three types of membership statuses with AKL:

- Active Members are enrolled in classes and on campus. This includes both initiated and new members.
- Alumni Members have graduated or left school and are not on campus.

— Expelled Members are those who, for individual reasons, are no longer members of the Fraternity. Chapters must complete an expulsion process to expel members.

Each member also has a “billing status” that refers to what each individual member should be billed prior to the semester starting. Billing statuses must match individual membership statuses to ensure proper billing.

Membership Entry & New Member Reporting

Once a new member accepts his bid to become a member of the Fraternity of Alpha Kappa Lambda, he must be added online via OmegaFi Vault to be officially added to the chapter roster.

Once added to the roster, he is officially a new member of the Fraternity and must begin his five day Membership Entry Process. The first step of the process is having each new member complete their new member paperwork.

Once completed, new members are then eligible for Initiation. After new

members have been initiated, chapter officers are responsible for completing an Initiation Report. New members will not be listed as “Initiative - Active” on the chapter roster until an Initiation Report has been submitted.

AKL Online Education

AKL Online Education is compiled of modules for new members, chapter officers, and all active undergraduate members. AKL Online Education is accessible to all brothers by logging into myAKL. All new members are required to complete “AKL Foundations” prior to Initiation. This module is designed to make joining members better leaders by educating them on the issues facing college students today.

National Fraternity Resources

One of the benefits in Alpha Kappa Lambda is our vast library of online education available to all members. There are specific officer trainings that every member of the Fraternity can utilize, including:

In addition to these officer trainings, there are four fundamental courses available to members. All members are required to complete "AKL Foundations".

They are encouraged to participate in our other continuous education courses AKL Online Education can be accessed by logging into myAKL.

AKL Foundations

The AKL Foundations course of the New Member Entry Process is designed to make joining members better leaders by educating them on the issues facing college students today. As members of the Greek system, students are campus leaders and role models.

As leaders they may face difficult and challenging situations. It is how they respond to these difficult situations that help them learn and develop into effective leaders who make a positive contribution to the campus community.

While our members may not encounter these challenges personally, they may have brothers or friends who do. Through the AKL Foundations course our members will practice the decision making necessary to effectively deal with alcohol and drugs, hazing, sexual violence, and mental health issues in AKL chapters and the community.

AKL Foundations will also cover; Drugs & Alcohol risk management and best practices, Anti-Hazing education, Sexual Violence Prevention, and Mental Health resources.

SPEAK UP Sexual Violence Prevention

This course will educate members of AKL as to the devastating impact of sexual violence on victims, in fraternities and sororities, and the university community. Many members will say initially that "I would never do anything like that." or "That does not happen in my chapter."

Name Your Story Mental Health Education

By completing the Name Your Story Mental Health Education course, members will become aware of the most common mental health disorders diagnosed among college students including depression, anxiety, suicide, and related risk behaviors involving alcohol, illicit drugs, and non-medical use of prescriptions drugs.

Recognize / Challenge / Change Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Education

Recognize. Challenge. Change. is an honest conversation about our increasingly interconnected and diverse world. Participants will challenge myths regarding the historical and present day distributions of power, investigate the role of racism and anti-racism in social, professional, and educational spaces, and feel empowered to analyze their own social identities and positions within systems of power.

Growing The Fraternity

“Recruitment is the lifeblood of the Fraternity.”

Recruitment Minimums & Results

In order for any organization to be sustainable and grow, every member must be committed to recruitment. Fraternity recruitment should not be the sole responsibility of the Recruitment Chair.

Every undergraduate member should strive to recruit one new member per semester to assist chapter and fraternity growth. Members who are graduating at the end of the semester should aim to recruit two new members, one to fill your spot and a second to help the fraternity grow.

Every year, the National Fraternity sets Recruitment Minimums for each AKL chapter. These minimums are based on campus size, past recruitment targets and achievements, and input from the chapter leadership. The following chart is the 22-23 academic year Recruitment Minimums and results following the 2022 Fall semester.

National Membership Entry Fee

This is a one-time National Membership Entry Fee to join the Fraternity of Alpha Kappa Lambda. The National Membership Entry Fee must be paid in full along with the National Dues within 30 days of joining. Full or partial payment of all charges prior to Initiation is strongly encouraged. While individual new members are responsible for paying their balance, the chapter is responsible for making sure the Membership Entry Fee and National Dues are paid in full. If a member drops or is removed from the roster, the chapter is still responsible for making sure that individual pays, otherwise it is the responsibility of the chapter.

National Membership Dues

The National Dues are billed twice a year and are to be collected from every man on the roster. Billing occurs in August and January. The National Dues must be paid along with Insurance within 15 days of the start of the semester.

Insurance

The Insurance is billed twice a year and is to be collected from every man on the roster. Billing occurs in August and January. The Insurance must be paid along with National Dues within 15 days of the start of the semester.

Educational Programming Fee

Previously called the Meetings Fee, the Educational Programming Fee serves the same purpose and is billed once a year and is to be collected from every man on the roster. Billing occurs in January. The Educational Programming Fee must be paid along with the National Dues & Insurance within 15 days of the start of the semester.

Chapter/Local Dues

The chapter must charge chapter/local dues to pay for events and activities. This must be billed via OmegaFi and no money should be taken via cash or payment app for proper record keeping and to avoid any potential issues regarding mismanagement of funds.

Accounting/OmegaFi Fee

The chapter must account for the Accounting/OmegaFi fee for budgetary purposes. This fee is collected from every member to pay for OmegaFi services. This must be billed via OmegaFi.


